

# **Expression of Interest – CWELCC Child Care Space Expansion**

On March 27, 2022, Ontario reached a \$13.2 billion agreement with the federal government for a Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) system. The new system will lower child care costs and improve access, quality and inclusion across Ontario's child care and early years sector.

Child Care is foundational to supporting early childhood development, learning, well-being, and student success. It is also a key enabler of workforce participation, particularly for women, both as parents and providers.

Ontario's Action Plan for implementing CWELCC includes developing a framework for targeted space creation and providing funding to support the creation of new, affordable child care spaces for eligible children in targeted locations and for populations most in need. Under the CWELCC Agreement, Ontario will support the creation of approximately 86,000 new licensed child care spaces by December 2026.

To support the CWELCC vision, the Ministry of Education has provided funding to the District of Parry Sound Social Services Administration Board (DSSAB) to create 129 new affordable licensed child care spaces in neighborhoods with populations who need them most. To date the DSSAB has created 99 new child care spaces as per our Directed Growth Plan. The DSSAB has an allocation of 30 new child care spaces to be created in 2026.

The new licensed child care spaces include a mix of not-for-profit and for-profit centre and home-based settings to provide families with choice and flexibility. Under the agreement, Ontario has committed to maintaining or improving the proportion of not-for-profit licensed child care spaces for children aged 0 to 5 at 70% or higher by 2026. In the District of Parry Sound, 92% of licensed child care spaces for children in this age group are currently operated on a not-for-profit basis.

The province has created two funding programs to support the creation of new CWELCC child care spaces as approved by the DSSAB in alignment with their Directed Growth Plan. Eligible Operators may apply for funding under these programs;

#### 1. Start- Up Grant Funding

Start-up grants support the creation of new licensed full day spaces for children under age six in targeted neighborhoods for underserviced communities and populations.



Eligible centre-based applicants can receive a grant of up to \$350,000 for every 20 child care spaces created. Eligible home child care licensees can receive grants of up to \$1,200 per CWELCC space created, to a maximum of \$7,200 per provider.

Licensed child care programs for kindergarten and school-aged children and before and after school programs are not eligible for start-up grants funding.

#### 2. Early Learning and Child Care Infrastructure Funding

The ELCC Infrastructure Fund supports the creation of new full day spaces for children 0 to 4 years of age for not-for-profit licensed child care centres enrolled in CWELCC. This funding aligns with Ontario's Access and Inclusion Framework and complements the Start-up Grant program.

Eligible centre-based applicants can receive up to \$1,500,000 for the creation of new full day child care spaces serving children 0 to 4 years of age.

Licensed home child care agencies and licensees operating for-profit child care centres, as well as licensees operating school-based child care centres, are not eligible to receive ELCC Infrastructure Fund funding.

## **Application Process**

The DSSAB has developed an Expression of Interest (EOI) application to ensure a transparent and equitable approval process. The EOI aims to identify licensed child care service providers — either currently operating or proposing to operate — within the District of Parry Sound who are interested in creating new CWELCC-funded, community-based licensed child care spaces by December 31, 2026, with a focus on priority neighborhoods and priority populations.

The DSSAB is inviting applications from applicants interested in creating up to 30 child care spaces in the district under the CWELCC System. This expansion could be achieved by adding additional spacing into an existing child care space or by opening a new location. Funding is available to support the new spaces up to maximum amounts for



eligible applicants. Applicants who are approved to move on to the next stage will be eligible to apply for funding to support the creation of the new spaces.

This EOI invites applicants to complete an application for proposed new licensed child care spaces. Applications will be assessed in accordance with the assessment criteria found in Appendix A. Carefully review the instructions below before completing the application. Applicants approved to move to the next stage will engage in discussions with the DSSAB and will be required to provide operational and capital budget information to the DSSAB. Projects must demonstrate financial viability. Funding to support the operation of eligible spaces is available through the application of the cost-based funding formula as per Ministry guidelines.

Interested service providers must submit a completed EOI to the DSSAB Children's Services Manager at <a href="mailto:ccsm@psdssab.org">ccsm@psdssab.org</a> for review and assessment of funding eligibility. Receipt of the EOI will be confirmed by email.

#### Instructions

- 1. Complete all questions in the CWELCC Space Expansion Application template.
- 2. All sections of the form must be completed for the Application to be considered for funding. **Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.**
- 3. The proposal must be signed by the person with financial signing authority according to the By-Laws of the incorporated body, otherwise it will be deemed incomplete.
- 4. Applications will be reviewed, and applicants will be informed in writing of the outcome of their application. All assessment criteria as outlined in Appendix A will be assessed in accordance with the parameters for the child care centres and the identified needs of the priority neighborhood. All decisions regarding funding are final.
- 5. If you are a successful applicant, you will be notified and invited to move to the next step in the approval process. This may include applying for Start-Up Grant Funding and/or ELCC Infrastructure Funding.
- 6. Participation in the CWELCC System and entering into a Purchase of Service agreement with the DSSAB for the provision of Fee Subsidy and CWELCC funding is required. Agreements will be established exclusively with licensed child care service providers.

# **Appendix A: Assessment Criteria**

## **Assessment of the Proposal**

The following criteria will be assessed using the indicators outlined in this chart to assign an individual score for each category area. The total scores in each category are then weighted to equal 100 points, as follows:

Complete Application (must be a complete application to be considered)	0
A) Access = 25 points	/25

Enrolled in CWELCC System	/5
Demonstrated ability to fill child care spaces	/5
Commitment to provide non-standard hours of care (early morning, evenings, weekends, overnight)	/10
Proposed Spaces Age Group: Spaces maximize age grouping for children under 5 years	/5
B) Operational Preparedness= 40 points	/40
Item	Points
Demonstrated good governance and strong organizational leadership	/10
Demonstrated administrative strength	/10
Demonstrated knowledge and experience of applicant	/10
Readiness – commitment to be operational prior to December 31, 2026 will be given greater weighting	/10
C) Inclusion = 35 points	/35
Item	Points
Ability to support priority populations – weighting will be based on the number of priority populations targeted	/25
Type of Provider/Licensee: The DSSAB is required to maintain the auspice ratio as determined by the province.	/10
